THE LORD IS WORKING OVERTIME!

So This spring, Bishop Todd visited numerous churches in four parishes in the diocese, confirming and baptizing the growing number of parishioners. At the Cathedral complex he confirmed 103 candidates. The singing of the congregation lifted spirits during the 4-1/2 hour service.

So Out in the bush among the Mahafaly, where Todd placed a new Evangelist 18 months earlier, fellowship has grown from one church with 3 members to 5 churches with over 700-800 worshipers! In May the Bishop baptized an additional 195 parishioners.

So The ceremonial ground breaking for the new Cathedral to be built in the Diocese of Toliara was held on May 17th. Prayers were offered that God's hand guide the construction and raising of the additional funds needed to complete this project. Afterwards there was a formal signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Diocese of Toliara and the PRP, with a reception following. Representing PRP was board member Ed McNamara.

Some in Mahaboboka, St. Paul's Primary School was dedicated on May 18th with over 400 people in attendance. Along with the clergy and the mayor, Ed McNamara and his grandson, Gordon, participated in the ceremonies. The school was partially funded by Ed's church, Trinity Church, Potsdam, NY. The opening has ignited other Deaneries to consider establishing schools.

Sebuilding continues from Cyclone Haruna. The old church in Andranovory and the rectory in Sakaraha were both completely destroyed; new buildings are being constructed.

IMPRESSIONS FROM SERVICES AT BETIOKY John Griffin, Treasurer of PRP

During a recent visit I accompanied Bishop Todd to Betioky and I'd like to share this account of my weekend travels with you. Inspiring but tiring!

☞ First we went to a village called Andohasatra just outside the town of Betioky, a 4.5 hours drive out of Toliara, with only the first hour on pavement. The dirt road is okay when dry, but impassable when wet.

S> The Saturday service started at 11:00 and went on for 3 hours. Everyone met under a tree. Todd, the priest and the evangelist had a sunshade made from corrugated iron. Church pews were 2 poles driven in the ground with a rough plank nailed across. A few lucky candidates had benches brought from the school! Most sat on the ground.

So In total 115 people were baptized, a mix of young and old, male and female, from the village and from the village next door.

So There are no hymn books or bibles. The evangelist shouts the words just before the congregation sings the line.

All this in a place where there was no church community until very recently - with a single evangelist in Betioky town. As Todd put it - 'The lord is doing something here – we're trying to keep up!'

Shifter lunch with the parish, we drove on to the town of Betioky, around 13 km further along the dirt road.

So The church community meets on a rented plot where the evangelist lives.

Since many had come from the next village, they stayed the night sleeping on big tarpaulins on the ground.

So The following day the 4 hour confirmation and communion service started around 8:30. The tarpaulins people had slept on were transformed into awnings to keep off the sun.

So The confirmations – the first in that church – just went on and on – 120 were confirmed, again young and old. Each one was given a certificate and a bible.

So They have to pay 1000 ariary (just under 50 cents) for the certificates. Compared with an income of 1 or 2 dollars a day it is a lot!

Again the songs with no hymn books, and the service with no prayer books... it didn't reduce the sense of worship!

Solution A fter the service we had lunch with the evangelist and then looked at a plot of land next door that's for sale. Todd paid a deposit. The land will cost around \$2000 and \$10,000 to \$15000 for a church. There's no doubt it is needed!

Share All this in a place where two years ago there were less than five worshippers − now there are well over 200 who regularly attend.

So When everything was finished, we drove back to Toliara, complete with a goat that the congregation had given to the bishop!
